This edition, meet our **Vice Chair**, Richard Butler:

Richard joined our great game 59 years ago and has been an active Scout ever since. Having held a number of appointments locally Richard was a trainer at Scout HQ from the mid 80s, National Scout Chairman and then National Commissioner. He chaired the change from a male only organisation to the coeducational movement we now operate. Appointed County Commissioner for Norfolk in 2000 and he served until 2010.

His involvement in the Norfolk International Jamborees started in 1969 when he helped collect firewood, the last Jamboree before Norjam stopped. Richard was involved from 1983 when Norjam restarted and has attended all Jamborees since. Between 1992 until 2023 he was Chair or Camp Chief to the last seven Jamborees.
